Lectio Divina

Read: The first reading is a capsule of Peter's Pentecost speech to the visitors from many nations who had converged on Jerusalem for the feast. The Letter of Peter reminds us that Jesus' death offers salvation to all people. The Gospel recounts the disciples' encounter with Jesus on the road to Emmaus.

Reflect: The Gospel today presents a short course in evangelization. Jesus meets the disciples as they travel and begins a discussion with them about what they have experienced. Jesus then helps them to understand their experience in light of Scripture, reflecting on what God is doing in their Finally, Jesus brings them together as the table and they recognize him in the breaking of the bread. We are called to follow this example, reaching out without prejudice or distinction, without regard to race, class, or other division. We meet people where they are, walking alongside them on their journey through the challenges of life, sharing with them insights from Scripture and Church teaching, helping them to become aware of God's action in their lives. Hopefully, they will come to unity with Christ in his Body, the Church, around the Eucharistic table.

Pray: Lord, help me to share your Gospel with those I meet.

Act: Extend an invitation to participate in Mass or another event at your church.



WHAT THE 1ST READING **SAYS TO ME**. This passage is the first of six major sermons in Acts. All of these six sermons deal with the substance of the Christian message. It is "Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life. Jesus, come in glory". Peter's citation from Psalm 16 illustrates the freedom with which the early Church made use of the Hebrew Bible. The Psalm describes God as saving his chosen ones from destruction. Peter applies this to God's chosen one par excellence, Jesus Christ, and brings out his point: God raised up Jesus from the dead according to his "set plan and foreknowledge."

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

The writer describes Christ's death and its salutary effect on us in terms of the Jewish passover: sojourn in a strange land and deliverance by the blood of a spotless passover lamb. We are still in a strange land, but we are delivered by Christ our Passover sacrifice. For final deliverance from pain and evil, we have "faith and hope...in God."

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

This story is one of the most beautifully written by Luke and it offers a wealth of theological (religious) insight. God's word should be "burning within" us as often as we meditatively read it at home and listen to it in church. Meeting the Lord Jesus in the breaking of bread (the Eucharistic celebration) should open our eyes ever more! "Lord Jesus, open the Scriptures to us; make our hearts burn while you speak to us."

Priest Reports Possible Eucharistic Miracle at Connecticut Church

A local Connecticut television station is reporting that the Archdiocese of Hartford investigating possible Eucharistic miracle that may have taken place during the celebration of Mass at St. Thomas Catholic Church in Thomaston. Blessed Father Michael McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus, served as pastor of St. Thomas Church from 1884 until his death at age of 38, on the eve of the Assumption, in 1890. On March 5, at the conclusion of Mass, Father Joseph Crowley announced that a Eucharistic minister witnessed something unexplainable as he was distributing Communion. "One of our Eucharistic ministers was running out of Hosts and, suddenly, there were more Hosts in the ciborium. God just himself duplicated in the ciborium," an emotional Father Crowley told the faithful. "It's really, really cool when God does these things, and it's really, really cool when we realize what he's done, and it just happened today," the priest said. "Very powerful, very awesome, very real, very shocking. But also, it happens, and today it happened," he said. "They were running out of Hosts, and, all of a sudden, more Hosts were there. So today, not only did we have the miracle of the Eucharist, we also had a bigger miracle. It's pretty cool," the priest said.
