## WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

This Beautiful narrative tells about God's prophet in trouble. Elijah had confronted the prophets of Baal, the god Queen Jezebel worshiped. He took a stand that caused him to lose Jezebel's favor. She threatened the prophet's life. Elijah went to a cave where he met the Lord - not in a mighty wind, an earthquake, or fire, but rather in a tiny whispering sound. A lesson for the prophet so fond of the spectacular!

As Christians, we know that the bible does not tell stories just to entertain us. Inspired by God, the sacred writer wants to teach by relating these ancient traditions to the believing reader. The point of the narrative is God's word to us. In this case, it could be a hint as to what we should do when evil besets us, and /or that we should find God not in the spectacular but in the simple events of daily life. In times of confusion, our prayer should be: "Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation"

## WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul expresses his love for his people of origin in strong language that might scandalize if taken literally. They were chosen by God & received the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; they gave birth to the patriarchs and indeed to Christ himself! His example could be a lesson to love, respect, and care for others even if we cannot share their opinions!

### WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO

Matthew has molded this tradition in such a way that it is clearly a lesson for the harassed Church of his day & God's people of all times! The Church, the traditional bark of Peter, is tossed on the waves of affliction. It needs encouragement. It should have faith in Jesus, for he saves us if we have faith & pray with confidence. Jesus is able to still any storm & can bring us to safety

### **KNOW YOUR CHURCH**

Lisbon, Portugal — August 3, 2023

As Pope Francis officially launched a gathering of hundreds of thousands of Catholic young people here in the Portuguese capital, one direct message was repeated throughout multiple speeches — lest anyone forget it: Everyone is welcome in the church.

"There is room for everyone in the church and, whenever there is not, then, please, we must make room, including for those who make mistakes, who fall or struggle," the pope told a crowd of nearly 500,000 young people gathered here in Lisbon's Edward VII Park on Aug. 3 for the official welcome ceremony of World Youth Day.

"The Lord does not point a finger, but opens wide his arms: Jesus showed us this on the cross," Francis continued. "He does not close the door, but invites us to enter; he does not keep us at a distance, but welcomes us."

The pope's emphasis on openness is simple and has come to define much of his 10-year papacy as he has continually tried to preach a message of welcome to historically marginalized groups in the church, including women, the divorced and remarried, and LGBTQ Catholics.

But it has been met with fierce resistance, including inside the church.

Just hours before World Youth Day began, Bishop Joseph Strickland of Tyler, Texas, took to social media to lament the "tragedy" of World Youth Day, which he said had "fallen prey to the current trend to secularize the Catholic Church." And last month, a biographer of Pope John Paul II — the founder of World Youth Day — criticized the event for lacking a "Christocent HERE IN LISBON, "Let these be days when we fully realize in our hearts that we are loved just as we are," the pope told a sea of young people draped in their country's respective flags, many of whom waited in the park for several hours to greet the pontiff.

Francis recalled that he had received letters from young people who have felt unwelcome in the church because of mistakes.

"Everyone needs to know that God is near, and that all he needs is a small response on our part in order to fill our lives with wonder," he told them.
