Lectio Divina

Read: The prophet Isaiah begs God the Father to establish his kingdom on earth, trusting that God will care for his people. Paul reminds the Corinthians that their faith has prepared them for Jesus' return and will keep them steadfast until that day. Jesus cautions his disciples to be ready to greet the Lord when he comes again.

Reflect: On the first Sunday of Advent, the priest began his homily by asking the assembly a question: If you knew that today would be the last day of your life, what would you do differently? plans for the day were simple. I went to Mass and spent the rest of the day writing messages in my Christmas cards. If it had been the last day of my life, I can't think of a better way to spend it than praying and telling those dear to me how much I love them. As we begin the season of Advent, reflect on what you would change about your life if you knew that Jesus was coming back soon. Since we don't know the day of his coming, start living as if the day is

WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

This is a prayer in time of distress. God's people who have returned from exile in Babylon are experiencing frustration. reconstruction has not worked as they had hoped. They attribute this to their own sins. May God intervene and help! The Responsorial Psalm is a similar prayer. The "shepherd of Israel" is God, leader of his chosen people, us. "The man of your right hand" is the king, representing the people, all of us. Our planet, our community, our family, and we ourselves-all need God to come and save us from the mess we have made of life so often! Advent, the four weeks of preparation for Christmas, means "coming". May God come in his Messiah, Anointed One, Jesus Christ! But in order to receive him, we must open up. "Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved".

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul sees the community of Corinth as waiting for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ. He thanks God for the favors bestowed on them in Christ Jesus, the gift of speech and knowledge. Later in the Letter, he will tell them to use these gifts well! Waiting and persevering to the end requires the strength of God, but they will succeed. "God is faithful." God's word to you could be: You are waiting for the final revelation of Christ. God has bestowed gifts on you. How are you using them? Persevering as a real Christian is not easy. Pray for it! God is faithful.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO

ME The meaning of this parable is clear. Our Lord is "abroad". He ascended to heaven, but he will come back. Are we doing our job? Indeed, we are the "now" generation. The young want to enjoy everything they can right now. They are like high school drop-outs who lack the energy to work first so as to

enjoy a more beautiful life later! Grown -ups may get drowsy, drift away from God, as can happen to partners in marriage. God said to the Church of Ephesus. "I hold this against you, you have lost the love you had at first". "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come."

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

Another liturgical year is ending this week. On Sunday, we will celebrate the First Sunday of Advent and, with it, a new church year. This month long liturgical season tends to sneak up on many of us. It appears quickly, almost suddenly, after Thanksgiving and then passes by rapidly as days in the global north grow shorter, academic semesters wrap up, the shopping season accelerates and holiday travel schedules and seasonal stress push even the calmest people to a breaking point. Given all of this, it can be difficult to acknowledge the presence of Advent, let alone take any time to reflect on its meaning and significance. It is for this reason that I thought it worthwhile to pause and reflect on the meaning of this season just days ahead of its start.

It will come as no surprise to regular readers of my column that one of my goto wisdom figures is the late Trappist monk, social critic, mystic and author, Fr. Thomas Merton. He wrote two essays in the 1960s that I find myself returning to almost annually to renew my understanding of and appreciation for Advent. Merton's 1963 article, "Advent: Hope or Delusion," which was later published in the book Seasons of Celebration, challenges Christians to think more deeply about what it is we are celebrating when we celebrate Advent and then Christmas. Do we embrace authentic Christian hope or do we reduce this liturgical time to a celebration of some kind of superficial and fleeting feeling of optimism? The latter, which is what many Christians think the season is about, can too easily be experienced as a form of escapism from the realities of life and history. On the contrary, as Merton writes: "In Advent we celebrate the coming and indeed the presence of Christ in our world.
