Lectio Divina

Read: Isaiah prophesies to the people of Israel that God will send a messenger who will announce their return from exile. God will gently lead his people home. The Second Letter of Peter reminds us that God does not work on our schedule. The day of the Lord will come when God wishes. We gave only to prepare in hope and peace. John the Baptist makes his appearance in the Gospel, calling the people to repent of their sins to be ready for the one who is to come.

Reflect: Being a messenger can be a difficult task. It's easy to share good news and tell people what they want to hear. But being the bearer of bad tidings is far less pleasant. It can even be dangerous. In some ancient societies, messengers who brought bad news were killed! Still, we are called to follow the example of John the Baptist, preparing the way of the Lord by calling people to conversion through a personal encounter with Jesus. Even more, we need to show the way by forgiving others, repenting of our sins and living a simple life.

Pray: Lord, come quickly. Do not delay!

Act:: Offer comfort and assistance to someone facing difficulties.

Second Sunday of Advent Prayer: Grace

As we continue down the Advent path on Advent II, we are constantly reminded of Christ's first coming while we watch and wait for his second coming. The prayer for the second Sunday of Advent puts it this way:

Father in heaven, who sent your Son to redeem the world and will send him again to be our judge: give us grace so to imitate him in the <u>humility</u> and purity of his first coming that, when he comes again, we may be ready to greet him with joyful love and firm faith; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The second Sunday in Advent (Advent II) continues on the path started in the <u>first week</u> by looking forward to Christ's first and second coming. Advent II focuses on John the Baptist, the Gentiles being included in God's family, Christ's coming in judgment and peace, and the church's hopeful expectation of the completion of his promises.

WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

In beautiful poetic language, the prophet tells the exiles in Babylon who were desperately waiting for freedom. Have hope! God will step in and lead you out of this hopeless situation back home! Notice God's "Like a shepherd he tender love: feeds his flock." What do we learn as God's word from this ancient piece of poetry? It could be: God cares! Your guilt is expiated. "Here comes with power the Lord God." Whatever your problems in life may be, you can have a happy Christmas and celebrate "Emmanuel-God with us." Make the Responsorial Psalm your prayer of today: "Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us vour salvation."

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

The author uses the familiar imagery of the Bible (a roar, fire, flames a meltdown) to describe the awesome event of Christ's coming in judgment. Remember, God's timetable is not ours. God can call you at any moment, and this should be a motivation to preserve holiness. While waiting, "be eager to be found without spot or blemish before him (God), at peace."

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO

ME Mark announces his Gospel as the good news of Jesus Christ the Son of God. But before he actually tells us about Jesus Christ and his good news, he introduces John the Baptist as our Lord's forerunner. Mark quotes Isaiah of the First Reading. Just as in ancient times messengers went ahead of the king to announce his coming to town, so John announced the coming of the Messiah, God's anointed vicegerent on earth, Jesus Christ. The mission of Jesus was prepared for by John. His mission was the same as that of Jesus, though he stressed a judgment whereas Jesus emphasized salvation. Notice the two aspects of John's message: (1) repentance, baptism,

f orgiveness, and (2) the coming of the more powerful, who will baptize the people in the Holy Spirit (i.e. immerse them in ... John thought of baptism by immersion !). If we are waiting for "salvation," a way out of a dim and unexciting existence, we should pay attention to these two aspects and apply them to ourselves.

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

The new head of the Vatican's doctrine office gave a homily in the suburbs of Rome this week in which he encouraged Catholics not to be like "hard stones" unwilling to change but to be like clay, ready to be transformed by the Lord.

Cardinal Victor Manuel Fernandez the prefect of the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, took possession of his titular church on Dec. 3 on the northern outskirts of Rome, the parish church of Sts. Urban and Lawrence at Prima Porta. In his homily, the Argentine cardinal, known as Pope Francis' longtime personal theologian and ghostwriter, reflected on the prophet Isaiah's words, "O LORD, you are our father; we are the clay and you the potter: we are all the work of your hands," on the first Sunday of Advent. "When these words are spoken with the heart, it means that we let ourselves be shaped by the Lord, that we let ourselves be led by him, that we let ourselves be transformed by his grace," Fernández "There are people who don't let themselves be transformed, and they say: 'I'm like this, I'm fine like this, what need do I have to change anything?' Others say: 'I don't commit serious sins, I'm not vicious like others, what do I need to change?' These people are not clay, they are hard stones that will not even be touched by the Holy Spirit. And then they die despite being alive because they no longer grow and improve, much less offer something new to the Lord." Fernández noted that the Buddhists invite us to be adaptable and able to take many shapes, like water, and that the Chinese Daoist philosopher Laozi said that we must be "like the flexible branches of trees."
