Lectio Divina

Read: In the first reading, God promises David that he will establish his kingdom and his royal line forever. This promise was fulfilled in the birth of Jesus, a birth announced by the angel Gabriel in today's Gospel. In his letter to the Romans, Paul explains that Jesus' birth is part of God's plan for our salvation and the cause of our joy.

Reflect: Our time of preparation and anticipation is almost over. The Lord is near. For what are we waiting? David waits for confirmation that his royal line would be secure and long lasting. Many of the people of Mary's time waited for a military leader who would overthrow the Roman occupation and bring a return to Israel's glory days. We may be waiting for our family celebrations and the present exchange. But the true gift, the gift of inestimable value, is the gift of eternal life that Christ brings to those who believe in him. Though our Advent is almost over, our wait continues. We will continue to wait, to prepare and to long for the day when our earthly journey will be completed and we will see God face to face.

Pray: Lord, make us ready to receive you. **Act:** Take a moment of silence in the midst of the bustle to give thanks to God.

WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

David, full of goodwill, wants to build a temple for God. But instead of David building a temple (house) for God, God will build a "house" an everlasting dynasty, for David: "Your house ... shall endure forever." In today's Gospel, Luke see this promise ultimately fulfilled in the universal kingship of the Lord Jesus. With this in mind, we should make the Responsorial Psalm our prayer of praise and thanksgiving for what God gave us in Jesus Christ.

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Only with the coming of Jesus Christ do we attain the right understanding of Israel's expectations. The mystery, hidden for many ages, is now revealed and made known to all the Gentiles. Salvation, coming to us through Jesus Christ, is for all. We should pray that all may see the real light of Christmas.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Here we concentrate on what Luke wants to teach us concerning this child about to be born. First, he wants our affirmation in faith that Jesus' origin is a transcendental one, that he is born from God. Secondly, Luke brings out what role this child is to play in Salvation History. He finds the clue for understanding this in the Old Testament. God had promised David that his dynasty (throne) would stand firm forever. Hence, the expectation that a descendant of David once again would rule the house of Jacob. Jacob, the Hebrew patriarch, stands for God's people), and that his reign would have no end. Luke sees this political expectation, which was very much alive in his day, fulfilled on a higher level in Jesus Christ, who will reign over God's people forever. "The Lord God will give him the throne of David his father." Let us admire God's way every year again during Advent and Christmas time, and accept Jesus Christ as Luke wants us to do.

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

The Vatican has issued new guidance on the topic of blessings of same-sex attracted people, stating that Catholic priests can bless same-sex couples as an expression of pastoral closeness without condoning their sexual relations. The ruling, which also applies to Catholics civilly remarried without having received an annulment as well as to couples in other "irregular situations," underscored that such blessings cannot be offered in a way that would cause any confusion about the nature of marriage, which the document affirms is the only "context that sexual relations find their natural, proper, and fully human meaning." "The Church's doctrine on this point remains firm," the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith (DDF) said in its Dec. 18 declaration. The declaration emphasizes that blessings may only be given "spontaneously" and not in the context of a formal liturgical rite. The guidance is the latest — and most authoritative — intervention by the Vatican on an issue that has embroiled the universal Church in recent years.

In September 2022, the bishops of the Flemish-speaking part of Belgium published a blessing ceremony for same-sex couples in their dioceses. The move appeared to be in stark contrast to the DDF's February 2021 affirmation that the Church did not have the power to impart blessings on unions of persons of the same sex. This past March, the controversial German Synodal Way approved a resolution to establish a formal liturgical blessing of same-sex unions as well as divorced and remarried Catholics. In August, the archbishop of Berlin said that he would not discipline priests who provided such blessings and published a roster of clergy willing to offer them. A group of cardinals wrote to the pope in July requesting clarification on the Church's stance on same-sex blessings, among other issues. Today's DDF guidance builds upon many of the themes Pope Francis laid out in his response to the cardinals, which was published by the Vatican in October.


