Lectio Divina

Read: Isaiah assures us that God's Word will always bear fruit and accomplish his will. Paul strengthens the Romans' faith, reminding them of what God has prepared for his faithful children. Creation itself will be redeemed. Death will be destroyed forever, Jesus preaches the Parable of the Sower, encouraging his listeners to allow God's Word to bear fruit in their lives.

Reflect: The Parable of the Sower can act as an examination of conscience. As we read this parable, we can reflect on the things that keep us from allowing the Word of god to bear fruit in our lives. Do we fail to take the Word of God seriously, ignoring what our consciences tell us and what the Church teaches? Is our faith shallow so that we are easily dissuaded from living as we claim to believe? Is our faith threatened by anxiety, greed or other distractions? How can we become good soil to receive God's Word? We can prepare our hearts by spending time in prayer, listening for the Lord's voice. We can make our spirits docile to God's will. We can ask God in his mercy to cleanse us of the sins that keep us from him.

WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

This poem, clear in itself, introduces the theme of today's Gospel: the fate or final outcome of God's word when (poetically speaking) it comes down from heaven to water thirsty ground. The poet wants to emphasize that God's word can bear fruit only when it is soaked up in human life. The point is: Do we listen? We cannot blame God for a lack of guidance. The Church reapplies Psalm 65 to stress this: "You (God) have visited the land and watered it (with your word); greatly have you enriched it."

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul offers his attitude toward the created world. God made the world, hence it must be good. Nevertheless, it is in slavery to corruption because of Adam's (every human being's) sin. As part of the created world humans groan too. But there is hope of liberation. We expect a new heaven and a new world. Redeemed humanity will live in peace with Godin a world transformed by his Spirit.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Before the parable of the sower finally ended up in the Gospel version of Matthew, it went through a long period of oral transmission. The first part (its short form) is substantially the parable as originally told by Jesus. allegorical interpretation at the end was added later. The discussion on the purpose of teaching in parables in between is also a later insertion that refers to the kingdom of God, mysteriously present in the works of Jesus. One may ask, if Jesus did not say all of this, is it nevertheless the word of God/ Yes it is. There is much in the Gospels that was not said by Jesus verbatim. Much of the Gospels is meditative interpretation of Jesus, spirit and attitude towards life. Later the Church recognized herself in the four Gospels, as we have them now, and accepted them as God's word. Since the point of the parable is offered by the Bible itself, we do not need to comment on it. Ask yourself this question: In reading your Bible and searching for the point (God's word to you), do you establish a living contact with God by meditative prayer? This is all that Christian Bible reading is about.

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

October Synod: 'Rooted in our tradition, we walk together'

Fr Jan Nowotnik, one of the non-bishop voting members at the upcoming Synod General Assembly, stresses "the seriousness of the moment", and his hope to "hear afresh what is important for the Church of today."

Last week, Fr Jan Nowotnik was named as one of the voting members of the upcoming General Assembly of the Synod, set to take place in October.

Vatican News spoke to Fr Nowotnik – who is Director of Mission for the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales – about his reaction to being selected, and the importance of the October

"Seeing my name on the list," says Fr Nowotnik, "felt quite an honour and a privilege."

At the same time, however, he stresses that "this is an important moment for the Church ecclesiologically", and that this is something he was "taking very seriously".

He recognizes the gravity of the moment, he says, and realizes that "not only do I need to be praying quite hard at the moment, but also asking the prayers of those I know who will be supporting the process."

Significance of the event

What's the point of the upcoming assembly? For Fr Nowotnik, it has to do with Pope Francis' desire for a Church that is "constitutively synodal". The Synod, that is, should not be thought of as a one-off event, but rather as an ongoing way of coming together as a Church.

"When we listen to each other," the priest says, "and particularly when we listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit, speaking to the Church through our prayer, through the Scriptures, through the liturgy, through our conversations with each other, we can hear afresh what is important for the Church of today."

The process so far, Fr Nowotnik adds, has brought many such contemporary themes in the Church to light. Some of these are positive – "the things that we hold in common, our love of Christ, our love of the Church, our desire to serve the Church and each other" – while others are less inspiring: "there aren't as many young people in church, the role of women, certainly the consequences of the sexual abuse within the Church".
