WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

During the time of affliction in the desert, God took care of his people and gave them the basics they needed, water and bread. But the writer of Deuteronomy, meditating on the desert experience of his people, lets Moses indicate that God intended more than just taking care of physical "(God) fed you with manna...in order to show you that not by bread alone does one live, but by every word that cometh forth from the mouth of the Lord. The psalmist, and we with him, thank God for his care. "With the best of wheat he fills you....He has proclaimed his word to Jacob (patriarch of God's chosen people, who stands for you and me). Praise the Lord, Jerusalem (capital of the chosen people, which again symbolizes you and me!)

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul does not want the Christians of Corinth to take part in pagan sacrifices to which relatives invite We have our passover sacrifice, the body and blood of Notice that in Biblical Christ. language, "body and blood" do not indicate the things as such but the whole person and the event that they signify, namely, Jesus Christ giving himself in his meritorious death, in which we share when we partake in the Eucharist. Moreover, Paul teaches that not only is such partaking communion with the Lord and a guarantee for salvation. It also means communion with the fellow members. God's word: Heed both aspects of Holy Communion!

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Every time we take part in the Eucharistic celebration, we should enter a more intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. Notice again that the words, "flesh, body, blood" stand for the person! "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him, " and through that continuous encounter with our Lord, such persons will have real life, life everlasting.

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

Pope Francis is awake after reacting well to both surgery and general anesthetic, an Italian surgeon said Wednesday afternoon. Pope Francis "is well, awake, alert, and already made his first joke 10 minutes ago," Dr. Sergio Alfieri said June 7 during a brief press conference at Rome's Gemelli Hospital, where Pope Francis is recovering following abdominal surgery. Alfieri, director of the hospital's abdominal surgery department, is the same surgeon who removed part of Pope Francis' colon during an operation to treat diverticulitis in July 2021. surgeon told journalists that from a medical point of view, there would be nothing preventing the pope from continuing with his planned travels to Portugal and Mongolia in August after his recovery. The conditions treated by the surgery on June 7 and the prior operation of July 2021 were both benign and have been resolved, the surgeon said in response to questions. The pope does not have other illnesses," he underlined. Alfieri noted that Francis had been experiencing pain for several months due to an incisional hernia and decided June 6 to undergo the surgery to correct it. An incisional hernia is a type of abdominal wall hernia at the site of a previous surgical incision. The surgeon said the hernia may have come about following past operations Francis underwent in Argentina, including for peritonitis, a redness or swelling of the lining of the abdomen often caused by appendicitis. Alfieri said Francis was already cracking jokes and had asked him when the next surgery would be.

In a statement issued late Wednesday, Vatican spokesman Matteo Bruni said "Pope Francis is alert and conscious and thankful for the many messages of closeness and prayer that have immediately reached him."

Alfieri was assisted by Drs. Valerio Papa, Roberta Menghi, Antonio Tortorelli, and Giuseppe Quero. The anesthetist was Dr. Massimo Antonelli, who was assisted by Drs. Teresa Sacco, Paola Aceto, Maurizio Soave, and Giuseppina Annetta. The head physician of the Vatican's health and hygiene office, Dr. Luigi Carbone, was also present in the operating room.
