WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME. Jeremiah is so appealing to us because he is very human. He knew what it means to be scared to death. When God called him, he tried to talk his way out of his prophetic vocation. "Ah, Lord God! I know not how to speak; I am too young". Yet though afflicted with fear and trembling this humble man ultimately accepted his mission. Unlike the "professional prophets," who were careful not to oppose the king and public opinion, Jeremiah spoke up and condemned evil. Hence, he was constantly harassed and persecuted to such an extent that martyrdom, rejection and persecution came to be regarded by later Israelites as inseparable from the prophetic Jesus and later Paul vocation. referred to the prophets, and especially Jeremiah, when they had to suffer for their vocation of being witnesses for God's kingdom. Jeremiah was afraid but he drew strength out of prayer. Consider his statement: "But the Lord is with me, mighty champion: my like a persecutors will stumble, they will not triumph." Jeremiah is a master of honest and simple prayer. We should learn from him!

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME We mentioned the power of evil opposing those who witness for god's kingdom of justice, love, peace and truth on earth. Paul meditates extensively on evil and its threatening power in society. The sin of the world is a fact. All of mankind is born into the sinful situation, which is the root of all misery in this world. But Paul also speaks about evil's defeat by Jesus' meritorious death on the cross. Threatened by evil and tempted by sin, we Christians trust in the redeeming power of our Lord Jesus Christ.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO

ME When the Lord sent his disciples on their mission to announce that the kingdom of God was at hand, to cure the sick and expel demons, he knew that the would run into opposition. He encourages them: "Fear no one...everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father." This is God's word to all Christians whenever their conscience tells them to witness.

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

Black Nun advanced to Sainthood By <u>Hannah Brockhaus</u>

Pope Francis has advanced the sainthood cause of Mother Mary Elizabeth Lange, a Black religious sister who founded the country's first African American religious congregation in Baltimore in 1829. The recognition of Lange's heroic virtue and advancement of her cause from servant of God to venerable was announced by the Vatican in a decree signed on June 22. The Church will now need to approve a miracle attributed to her intercession before she can be beatified.

Elizabeth Lange, as she was named, immigrated to the United States from Cuba in the early 1800s. Recognizing the lack of education for the children of her fellow Black immigrants, with a friend she established St. Frances Academy in her own home and with her own money to offer free schooling to Baltimore's African American children.

support of With the Baltimore Whitfield, she Archbishop James founded a school for "girls of color" and then the Oblate Sisters of Providence. the first religious community for women of African descent. The congregation's purpose was to provide religious and general education to African Americans. Lange and the other sisters also responded to other needs thev encountered over time, including taking in orphans and widows, educating freed slaves, nursing people dying during the cholera epidemic, and cleaning at St. Mary's Seminar Mother Mary Lange practiced faith to an extraordinary degree. In fact, it was her deep faith which enabled her to persevere against all odds," the Mother Mary Lange Guild notes in an online biography. "To her Black brothers and sisters, she gave of herself and her material possessions until she was empty of all but Jesus, whom she shared generously with all by being a living witness to his teaching." Lange died on Feb. 3, 1882, at the age of 92 or 93, and her cause for beatification was opened over a century later, in 1991, by Baltimore Cardinal William Keeler.
