#### Lectio Divina

Read: Paul comforts the Thessalonians by assuring them that those who die in faith will live forever in Jesus. The first reading sings of a woman's Wisdom who will always be near those who seek her. Jesus tells the parable of the wise bridesmaids who take care to prepare for the Bridegroom's arrival.

Reflect: Wisdom allows us to recognize God's plan and discern God's presence. To be wise by the world's standards is to have knowledge and show good judgment. To be wise by God's standards is to know God's will and act accordingly. That is how we prepare

for the arrival of the Bridegroom, Jesus Christ. The gift of wisdom helps us to conform our lives to God's will, so that we can be with the Lord forever. All of our earthly life is preparation for the world to come. We do not know how long our earthly lives will be or the day on which they will end. Yet we do not grieve the end of this life because we know that Jesus has prepared a place for us that is beyond our ability to imagine, where we will see God face to face.

## WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

The Book of Wisdom, the latest of the Old Testament Books, was written in Greek by a believing Jew living in Alexandria, Egypt. In it, Wisdom is personified, a literary device used often in all literatures of the world. Wisdom, which incorporates that mysterious dimension called faith, is a gift of "She (Wisdom) makes her own rounds, seeking those worthy of her." This God given Wisdom is resplendent and unfading! We should be grateful for it. (Responsorial Psalm)

## WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

As already mentioned, Paul wrote this letter to his newly founded congregation in Thessalonica. Timothy had brought him a good report concerning the behavior of these new converts. However, they had a few questions, one about death and the return of Jesus. This passage gives the Christian's answer, which is inspired not by human wisdom alone, but by a human-divine wisdom that we call Faith. Notice that the way the message is worded is conditioned by time and culture: (1) Paul is under the misconception that our Lord will return during his own lifetime. (2) He uses the traditional Biblical imagery of clouds, angels, blasting trumpets, etc., to describe God's splendor and our sharing in it. (3) He describes the event against the background of the world vision of his time: heaven up—earth in the middle netherworld (hell) down. Only the message: "We shall always be with the Lord" is God's word to us. The way the message is worded is not part of it.

#### WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO

ME Today's Gospel has the same message as found in the Second Reading. But now in the form of a parable. As we have this parable revised and edited by Matthew, it deals with two classes of people: the

foolish ones who were not ready, and those who had wisdom and were ready when the groom (Jesus) arrived. Always be prepared to meet the Lord!

Vatican City, Oct 26, 2023 / 06:55 am Pope Francis denounced clericalism and called it a "scandal" to see young priests buying lace vestments at tailor shops in a strongly-worded speech to the Synod on Synodality on Wednesday. Speaking to an assembly of hundreds of synod members on Oct. 25, the pope said that when clerics overstep their roles and "mistreat the people of God, they disfigure the face of the Church with macho and dictatorial attitudes." Francis described the faithful people of God as "patiently and humbly enduring scorn, mistreatment, and marginalization of institutionalized clericalism." "It is enough to go into the ecclesiastical tailor shops in Rome to see the scandal of young priests trying on cassocks and hats, or albs and lace robes," he added. "Clericalism is a thorn. It is a scourge. It is a form of worldliness that defiles and damages the face of the Lord's bride," he said. "It enslaves the holy, faithful people of The pope made his speech God." during the final week of the nearly month-long synod assembly, where he listened to the interventions of cardinals, bishops, priests, religious sisters, and laypeople speaking about "synodality" and their experiences in the Church. Pope Francis cited only one delegate's intervention in his speech that of Sister Liliana Franco, a Colombian religious sister who was one of 42 women who participated in the Amazon Synod, where she spoke at a controversial tree planting ceremony in the Vatican Gardens. In his speech, Pope Francis praised the female intuition that led women to approach Jesus' empty tomb after the Resurrection. He noted that many members of the Church hierarchy received their faith from their mothers and grandmothers, adding that the faith is often transmitted "in a feminine dialect." Much of the pope's speech focused on "the scourge" of clericalism and worldliness, a theme that the pope has been focused on since the start of the synod.
