Lectio Divina

Read: Isaiah describes the lavish banquet that God has prepared for the faithful who will spend eternity in his kingdom. In God's kingdom, sadness, hunger, pain and death no longer exist. But until we get to the heavenly kingdom, we, like Paul, must learn to live with conditions of want and plenty, sorrow and joy. These trials prepare us for the wedding banquet of the king to which all are invited.

Reflect: When I was young I found it hard to understand why anyone would pass up the chance to go to a wedding banquet. After all, what's not fun about a huge party with family and friends, good food and wine? As I grew older and my responsibilities increased, the time, energy and expense required by such an event began to seem too much and I began to sympathize with the people who declined the king's invitation. But God's invitation to the wedding banquet of the Lamb is far more precious than other invitations. We are invited to dwell with God forever, on his holy mountain. Responding to this invitation is not easy. It requires preparing our hearts through conversion, penance and acts of loving service.

Pray: Lord, make me worthy to sit at the banquet of the Lamb.

Act: Invite a friend to share a meal.

WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

Eating or "breaking bread" with a person is a biblical sign of intimate friendship. Isaiah locates the banquet of the end-time (the time of God's kingdom on earth) on Zion, the holy mountain of the Lord in Jerusalem. God will take away the veil that keeps us from seeing him. He will open the eyes of faith and we will recognize him as "our God." "Behold our God, to whom we looked to save us. This is the Lord for whom we looked." Responsorial Psalm describes the bliss of God's kingdom with the pastoral imnage of shepherd and sheep. It is a beautiful poem. Read it meditatively!

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul in prison had received a gift of money from the congregation of Philippi. He is grateful and appreciative. "it was kind of you to share in my distress." And God will reward you: "My God will fully supply whatever you need." God's message to us could be: Be concerned and help, when you know a fellow human enduring hardship.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO

The Longer Form of this ME: Bible reading may puzzle the reader. Why does the king cast out a guest for not being properly dressed for the occasion when the guests are "whomever you find" on the byroads? Maybe the poor fellow came from his field where he had been working all the day! answer is that actually this passage consists of two parables that first went through the process of oral tradition and finally were fused together by Matthew. When one takes the second parable on the wedding garment as such, the message (God's word) is clear: When you accept the invitation to God's banquet (the Holy Eucharist— God's companionship in heaven) you are supposed to be clean.

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

Vatican City October 4th, 2023

Pope Francis on Oct. 4 officially opened a long-anticipated Vatican summit on the very future of Catholicism, encouraging its participants — bishops and laypeople alike — to reject the temptations of doctrinal rigidity and to embrace a vision of the church that is open and welcoming to all. The blessing and welcoming gaze of Jesus prevents us from falling into some dangerous temptations: of being a rigid church, which arms itself against the world and looks backward; of being a lukewarm church, which surrenders to the fashions of the world; of being a tired church, turned in on itself," Francis said in a homily in St. Peter's Square that marked the start of the monthlong Synod of Bishops' synod on synodality. Some 450 delegates from all over the world have descended onto Rome for the occasion, representing a wide array of views and often sharp divisions on some of the hot button issues facing the church, such as clergy abuse, the role of women's ministry, inclusion of LGBTQ Catholics and other questions surrounding the structure of church authority. While the synod will allow widespread debate on these issues, the pope used his opening homily to caution against relying on "human strategies, political calculations or ideological battles" and instead urged "unity and friendship" in the weeks ahead. This is the primary task of the synod: to refocus our gaze on God, to be a church that looks mercifully at humanity," he said. "A church that is united and fraternal, that listens and dialogues: a church that blesses and encourages, that helps those who seek the Lord, that lovingly stirs up the indifferent, that opens paths in order to draw people into the beauty of faith. A church that has God at its center and, therefore, is not divided internally and is never harsh externally," he continued. Francis went on to draw a parallel to the Second Vatican Council, the series of pivotal 1962-65 assemblies instituted a number of church reforms, and were widely viewed as opening the institution up to the modern world
