WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

The Jews knew the directives of Sirach, and Psalm 103 as well as the challenge of Scripture to be holy as God is holy! "Wrath and anger are hateful things." But they also had the civil law of talion: "An eye for an eye." Many were selective. Soothing their consciences by selecting that civil law for personal behavior, they ignored the best in their Scriptures. Christians are also tempted to be selective. We must realize that listening to this Scripture on Sunday and yet practicing any king of vendetta is inconsistent and un-Christian.

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul offers the Biblical outlook on human beings. They are not autonomous. They are God's stewards living with him in a sacred partnership (covenant). It is a beautiful philosophy of life. As God's partners, we can and must develop our potentialities, but we remain responsible to the Lord. Do we develop potential for love, as suggested in the First Reading and the Gospel?

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

All Catholics in this country hear this same Gospel today, all Christians have it in their Bible, and all pray: "Our Father ...forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. "Yet some favor violence and hatred to solve both social and personal Can a real Christian be issues. selective. ignore God's whenever it is inconvenient, and practice what most do? Christian commitment is total and not selective! Jesus states: "Whoever is not with me is against me", and during Mass we pray: "May he (Christ) make us an everlasting gift to you (God).

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

The first Vatican assembly for the global Synod on Synodality will kick off in October bringing together clerics and laity alike for nearly one month of discussions. Here is what you need to know: What is the Synod on Synodality?

The Synod on Synodality, initiated by Pope Francis in October 2021, is a multiyear, worldwide undertaking during which Catholics were asked to submit feedback to their local dioceses on the question "What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our 'journeying together?"

The Catholic Church's massive synodal process has already undergone diocesan, national, and continental stages. It will culminate in two global assemblies at the Vatican. The first will take place Oct. 4–28 and the second in October 2024 to advise the pope on the topic "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission."

What does synodality mean?

Synodality was defined by the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith's International Theological Commission in 2018 as "the action of the Spirit in the communion of the Body of Christ and in the missionary journey of the people of God."

The 2021 synod preparatory document described synodality as "the form, the style, and the structure of the Church." The latest document published by the Vatican adds that synodality can also be understood as something that "does not derive from the enunciation of a principle, a theory, or a formula but develops from a readiness to enter into a dynamic of constructive, respectful, and prayerful speaking, listening, and dialogue." "At the root of this process is the acceptance, both personal and communal, of something that is both a gift and a challenge: to be a Church of sisters and brothers in Christ who listen to one another and who, in so doing, are gradually transformed by the Spirit," it says.
