WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

The exile in Babylon was experienced as God's punishment for Israel's sins. Israel had deserved to be abandoned by God. Now the prophet promises that freedom is at hand. Why? Because of Israel's "good works" in exile? No, because of God's generosity only! "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor your ways my ways, says the Lord." God does not owe the repentant scoundrel a thing. A sinner must return to God for mercy, and God forgives because he is generous. "The Lord is gracious and merciful" introduces the Gospel theme on God's generosity.

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul wrote the Letter to the Philippians, from which this reading is taken, while he was in prison in Ephesus (Turkey), where he faced the possibility of a death penalty for preaching the Gospel. "For to me life is Christ." Let us listen to the advice of this great apostle: "Conduct yourselves in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ."

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO

ME In the previous chapter Matthew Lord discussing conditions for a person to be saved. It is difficult for rich people since they feel so easily self-sufficient. same was true in Jesus' time. It was well-established who responded most willingly to Jesus' ministry but the outcasts, prostitutes and collaborators with the Romans (tax collectors). And Jesus paid more attention to them than to "respectable people" who thought that God owed them salvation because of their obedience to the Law of Moses. The parable, definitely not a lesson in labor relations, challenges this "more effort - more recompense" conception in religion. God does not owe salvation to anyone, even though this same misconception may still be alive in our day. It is a generous free gift. Note that rewards are not denied, but they should not be wielded as a key to open the gate of the kingdom of heaven.

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

What are the main questions that the Synod on Synodality will try to answer?

There are three overarching questions for the upcoming synod assembly as defined by the 2023 synod assembly's guiding document called the <u>Instrumentum</u> Laboris:

- 1. How can we be more fully a sign and instrument of union with God and of the unity of all humanity?
- 2. How can we better share gifts and tasks in the service of the Gospel?
- 3. What processes, structures, and institutions are needed in a missionary synodal Church?

The main objective of the first session in October will be to design a plan of study in a "synodal style" and to indicate who will be involved in those discussions, according to the *Instrumentum Laboris*. Discernment will be "completed" in the 2024 session of the synod.

What are some of the topics that could be addressed in the synod assembly?

The Instrumentum Laboris document guiding the discussions at the October synod assembly suggests discernment on questions regarding some hot-button including women deacons, topics, priestly celibacy, and **LGBTO** outreach. The document also highlights a desire for new institutional bodies to allow for greater participation in decision-making by the "people of God." One of the proposed questions for discernment for the synod of bishops asks: "What can we learn about the exercise of authority and responsibility from other Churches and ecclesial communities?" How does the Synod on Synodality differ from past synods of bishops? A synod is a meeting of bishops gathered to discuss a topic of theological or pastoral significance in order to prepare a document of advice or counsel to the pope.

For the first time, the Synod of Bishops in 2023 will include voting delegates who are not bishops. Nearly a third of the 364 voting delegates were chosen directly by the pope, including laypeople, priests, consecrated women, and deacons. Fifty-four voting members are women.
