5 WAYS TO CELEBRATE SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD & **BEYOND**

- 1. Enthrone a Bible in your home. Give the Word of God a prime place of honor and reverence in your home.
- 2. Commit to a Bible study, especially with a group. (Join the next 4 weeks Lenten Bible Study Session with Fr. Jean Paul in February)
- Begin reading the daily Mass readings. (purchase your copy of your Diocesan Calendar)
- 4. Commit to learning divina. Lectio divina literally means "divine reading." This can be done in your respective groups or start a group
- 5. Commit to a holy hour, at least once each week (sit quietly in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel in prayer)

Lectio Divina

READ: Jesus began preaching the Good News. He challenged people to repent and believe in the Gospel. Jesus was walking along the shore Galilee when he saw and called Simon and Andrew who were casting a net into the lake. They abandoned their nets and followed Jesus. Jesus also saw James and John, mending their nets. Jesus called them too. They followed Jesus, leaving everything behind.

REFLECT: Openness to God's grace is openness to the transformative power of God's word. Our life is in itself a grace. It is something that we receive. Unless we see this reality, we will never be open to God's word that has the power to change us. We listen to God's word with open hearts like those of children. In 2019, Pope Francis instituted the Third Sunday of January as the "Sunday of the Word of God." This reminds us to continue our faith journey with the word of God to guide, sustain and transform us into the persons God intends us to be. Jesus calls us to follow him. Like the first disciples called by Jesus, we are called to leave our old selves behind and lead a life of grace. A life changed for the better is a life of grace.

PRAY: Let us pray that we may be more open to listen to God's word that, in turn, we may also lead a life of grace.

ACT: Let us make it a practice reading the Bible regularly.

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO

ME. The theme of this passage is God's call and our response to be the kind of person the Maker has designed us to be. It is a call to repentance. The response: "They proclaimed a fast and all of them ... put on sackcloth" (Oriental sign of penance). This reading introduces Jesus' call for repentance in today's Gospel: "Repent, and believe in the gospel." It is a constant call to Christians of all times. We may pray: "Your ways, O Lord, make known to me; teach me your paths"

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS

TO ME We should first observe that Paul's statement of today is conditioned by his mistaken opinion that the parousia (Second Coming of Christ) would occur during his own lifetime. Does it make sense then to pay attention to this statement, since Paul's expectation was mistaken? Yes, it does, because it is still true that "the world in its present form is passing away." We should heed Paul's timeless advice that all human values, possessions, and even marriage are relative to the ultimate values of the hereafter: "They neither marry nor are given in marriage". Married people are necessarily involved in the cares of this world, but they should be careful not to attach their hearts to it. Their call involves both this life and the hereafter.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Like the author of Jonah Mark also deals with two calls. He first sets forth the call for repentance to all of us: "Repent, and believe in the gospel." Conversion, time and again averting yourself from evil in all its forms and converting yourself in even more perfect love to God, is a lifetime job that requires perseverance! Secondly, Mark relates another call of the disciples. Last week, we referred to "call-vocation," in particular to total dedication to Christ, including one's sexuality, as an ongoing process. The disciples have just spent the day with our Lord. In today's reading, we see a definitive decision. "They ... abandoned their nets [their father] and followed him. The first call to repentance is addressed to all Christians, the second one to those whom God calls to a life of service in the ministerial priesthood and/ or religious life. It requires generosity to respond. Pray that it always may be found among God's people!

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

Pope to priests of Rome: We are in a missionary land. Pope Francis meets with over 800 priests of the Diocese of Rome in the Basilica of St. John Lateran, and calls the clergy to bear credible witness to Christ and to keep their homilies brief and direct.

By Vatican News - A "missionary land". This was how Pope Francis described the Diocese of Rome on Saturday morning. He met in the city's Cathedral Basilica of St. John Lateran for his annual encounter with the clergy of Rome. The Pope arrived shortly after 9 AM, and was welcomed by Cardinal Angelo De Donatis, the Diocesan Vicar. To the over 800 priests, diocesans, religious, and permanent deacons serving the Diocese, the Bishop of Rome launched an appeal for the evangelization of the entire ecclesiastical community. The Pope also announced that he will resume visiting the parishes of the diocese, after the pause imposed by the pandemic.

Open, friendly dialogue

The meeting, which lasted about three hours, was reported in a statement from the Diocese of Rome to have taken place "with an open and familiar dialogue in cordial atmosphere." Following Midmorning Prayer, Cardinal De Donatis greeted the Pope, who then opened up the floor for questions. He invited them to ask questions freely and sincerely, fielding about thirty questions. Pope Francis spoke about the necessity evangelization in a pagan context, emphasizing the importance of bearing credible witness.

Blessing people, not sin

He then responded to questions about blessing homosexual couples, stating that the doctrine on the Sacrament of Marriage between a man and a woman has not changed, saying that people are blessed, not sin.
