### Lectio Divina

READ: Jesus was in Capernaum. He taught in the synagogue on the Sabbath. The people were astonished because Jesus taught them with authority. In that synagogue, there was a man with an evil spirit. The man with an evil spirit shouted while recognizing Jesus' identity as the Holy One of God. Jesus drove out the evil spirit. All the people were astonished.

REFLECT: The synagogue is a holy place. Sabbath is a holy time. This is a setting that invites us to deepen our relationship with God while heeding his words. The man with an evil spirit recognized Jesus as the holy One of God. This man was cognizant of Jesus' identity and authority. He was also aware of the power of Jesus' words that is eternal and divine. This is what the people failed to recognize. Astonished as they were, the people felt the authority of Jesus' words but would remain ignorant of Jesus' identity as the Holy One of God and as the Sovereign Lord. God can always perform astonishing miracles before our eyes but unless we recognize his Sovereign authority and lordship over us, our relationship with him will remain without depth.

**PRAY**: Let us pray that we may truly accept Jesus as our Sovereign Lord and that his words become truly authoritative over our life.

**ACT**: Let us deepen our knowledge of Jesus by taking time to study the Bible.

Theme: He Speaks with Authority Meeting people for the first time, hearing them in a public address, may prompt various reactions. We might state: "He/she did not impress me too much," that is, as a person he/she does not have much to offer. Our reaction could also be: "I was very much impressed, "that is, we see a person who stands for something, who is a real "somebody." This first impression, though perhaps mainly intuitive, is often decisive for our final opinion about a a person. Only for very good reasons do we revise it.

The Lord Jesus must have impressed people as a real "Somebody." He was so impressive that he has prompted people to agree with him, to give up everything and follow him, not just in his own time and country, but all over the globe and already for some 2,000 years.

## "Be Silent and come out of this man!"



### WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

Meditating on the great prophet Moses, the writer of Deuteronomy assures his readers that the prophetic office will be an ongoing process in Israel. "I [God] will raise up for them a prophet like you [Moses], ... and will put my words into his mouth." God will always guide his people through his "mouthpieces," the prophets.

Later, this text came to be regarded as teaching that God would send a final prophet. These are the terms in which Jesus saw him- self, and more explicitly in which the early Church understood him. Just as Moses spoke with authority, so did the Lord Jesus. "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts".

### WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Notice that Paul does not condemn marriage or sex as something inferior. He recommends celibacy as a way of life for those who are called to it, and offers just one reason for it (freedom to be concerned with things of the Lord). There are many more. You should read this passage in its total context of chapter 7, and remember that the background from which Paul reasons is the patriarchal marriage pattern of his time and culture, which as such is not part of divine revelation.

### WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

"The people were astonished at his teaching.... a new teaching with authority." Jesus says: "I say to you..." (Mt 5:34). The exorcism accompanying Jesus' teaching in Mark's account underlines this authority. Where God's word breaks through in human history, announcing the coming of his kingdom of justice, love, and peace, their evil must cease! Listen often and with faith to the Lord Jesus and his teaching with authority, as we have it in Scripture. "Astonished" by his words, you will keep balance in a society where so much other "wisdom" is for sale.

#### KNOW YOUR CHURCH

Having grown up in the 1950s, when sex was not an approved topic, I was in my late 20s before I knowingly had a conversation with someone who was gay. It was not until much later that someone explicitly told me that they were gay. Today in America, high schools have gay-straight alliances and you'd be hard-pressed to find a teenager who doesn't know someone who identifies as gay or queer.

Most of Africa's Catholic bishops grew up in a culture like the one I grew up in, when being gay meant being in the closet. And they still live there. In many African countries, homosexual activity is still a crime, as it was in the West for most of the 20th century.

It's not surprising that the African bishops have rejected Pope Francis' decision to green light the blessing of gay couples and others in relationships outside marriage. On Jan. 11, with the pope's approval, they issued a statement saying, "We do not consider it appropriate for Africa to bless homosexual unions or same-sex couples because, in our context, this would cause confusion and would be in direct contradiction to the cultural ethos of African communities."

Besides the moral question, the African hierarchy sees the push for LGBTQ rights as a form of neocolonialism. In addition, if the church begins welcoming gay people, they fear, they may lose followers to Pentecostal and evangelical churches, whose ministers would attack them for being gay friendly. Since the declaration allowing same-sex blessings was announced Dec. 12 by the Dicastery for Doctrine of the Faith, Cardinal Víctor Fernández, who heads the dicastery, has been forced to defend its orthodoxy. But he also gave bishops like the Africans room to disagree: "Prudence and attention to the ecclesial context and to the local culture could allow for different methods of application" of the new blessings rule, he has said.

t would be progress if the church in Africa would oppose the criminalization of homosexual activity. It is shameful that some bishops there publicly support laws against gay people. But blessing gays was a bridge too far in Africa.
