Lectio Divina

READ: Jesus was conversing with Nicodemus, telling him that the Son of Man must also be lifted up to bring salvation. Jesus continued by telling Nicodemus that God loved the world so much that he sent his only Son so that whoever believes in him (Jesus/ the Son) will not perish or be lost but will have eternal life. Jesus came not to judge the world but to save the world. Jesus further explained to Nicodemus that he (the Son) came as the light to the world but those who do evil hated the light because they did not want their wicked ways to be exposed.

REFLECT: The very reason why God sent his Son, Jesus Christ, into the world is to save the world. Why? It is because God loves the world so much, the world and all it contains. Love is the very energy that keeps the entire salvific process moving. God's love saves us. As followers of Jesus, we are called to become God's instruments of salvation in our world today and it is God's love that will enable us to participate in God's salvific act. Lent is a season that allows God's love to grow in us. Love must motivate our Lenten observances.

PRAY: Let us pray that the love of God may increase in us.

ACT: Let us do one act of goodness today while being fully conscious that we do it out of love and for the love of God.

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME:

The Jews in Babylonian exile stand for all who are alienated from God by sin. Only those who are aware of their alienation and are longing for home, salvation, lasting happiness, and peace can be saved. The Responsorial Psalm is a prayer of displaced Jews. "Zion" is the holy mountain in Jerusalem on which the temple was built. Both "Zion" and "Jerusalem" stand for "home." Every sinner is a displaced person. Make this psalm your Lenten prayer!

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul states that the salvation that the repentant sinner is hoping for is not our own doing. It is God's gift that we should accept in faith. Good works as such do not justify us but should be the consequence of our purification. Grateful for God's abundant love, the justified sinner spontaneously desires to do something in return.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

The Book of Numbers (21:4-9) relates a beautiful tradition. In the desert on their way to the promised land, some of the chosen people were bitten by serpents and many of them died. At God's command, Moses made a bronze serpent and mounted it on a pole. Whenever those who had been bitten by a serpent looked at the bronze serpent, they recovered. The serpent stands for the evil one (Jn 3:6). All who have been bitten must die, but looking to the Son of Man, lifted up on the cross, will save them.

Looking to Christ means, of course, looking with faith and repentance! Those who love darkness rather than light cannot be saved. Do you have a crucifix in your home and do you ever look at it with faith and repentance?

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

On a spring day in the mid-aughts, Fr. Stephen Fichter was grabbing a slice of pizza from a shop in Ho-Ho-Kus, New Jersey, when a boy from Fichter's church pointed to him and said, "I didn't know he could eat pizza!"

Almost two decades later, Fichter, pastor of St. Elizabeth of Hungary Church in Wyckoff, New Jersey, wants people to know that not only do priests enjoy gastronomic delights, they're also fully human.

"There's a sense of priests being a separate entity," said Fichter, who told Religion News Service that viewing priests purely as spiritual figureheads can, as the Catholic abuse crisis indicates, have dire consequences. And while reductive narratives in film and media depict priests as perfect heroes or evil villains, he said, truth is more complicated.

"I wanted to write a film that would strike a balance," said Fichter, who began developing the idea for the movie "Trinity's Triumph" in 1998.

Starring Emmy winner Joe Morton ("Scandal") and Emmy-nominated actor Young Mazino ("Beef"), "Trinity's Triumph" is now available to stream on Amazon Prime and other platforms. The first feature-length film written by a priest, according to Fichter, it follows three Catholic seminarians who tell corny jokes, sin occasionally and grapple with the demands of the priesthood.

How many people really want to have vows of celibacy, poverty and obedience?" Thomas Plante, a professor of psychology at Santa Clara University, emeritus professor at Stanford University and co-editor of Sexual Abuse in the Catholic Church: A Decade of Crisis. 2002-2012, said about the challenges faced by today's Catholic seminarians. "Our culture so much values sexual freedom, doing whatever you want, whenever you want, and we worship money and riches. It's so completely countercultural to go into this kind of life."
